"Oxygen": a dive in art at "Dòlaondes"

The photo shows a painting of "Oxygen", on exhibit in the aquatic centre of Canazei "Dòlaondes", with 5 swimming pools, among which a semi-olympic pool, a fun pool with neck showers and vortex, and a slide 111 m long, a Kids pool and an external saltwater pool.

A reminiscent way back to the most beautiful water, which lulled us in our childhood in the mother's belly. The exhibit by Claus Soraperra named "Oxygen (H₂O the return)" is inspired by the comforting sensation of our first dwelling. It is a multimedia show that is open until 20 september in the main hall of the aquatic centre "Dòlaondes" in Canazei, and displays the portraits of a diver, Klaus Dibiasi, jumping from the diving board in three moments (and therefore three positions), his flight before the impact with the liquid surface. There are also video broadcasting images and sounds of water, drops, melodies and baby's wailing. The work by Soraperra, representative of the Design and Arts School in Pozza, boast glowing reports by public and critics.

Amazing hikes

From Alba to Val de Grepa

From Alba take the cable car that brings you to the hollow of Ciampac, from where you will enjoy a wonderful landscape over Sella and Sassolungo. From here take path no.654, which ascends till Pian de Sele (2.352 m; 0,15 h). From here you will start a delightful descent towards the grassy Val de Grepa, populated by grazing cows and horses. You will reach the areas of Poze, Ardonei, Fraine, e Coi, passing by the foot of Col de Zacaron and Col de Jiadoi. The path leads to Fontanazzo, enters the wood and becomes steeper till it arrives at the stroll in the valley bottom that border on Avisio River (2,30 hrs). After passing the bridge on the stream you can reach the village, from where you can take public transport to get to Alba again (timetables at the Tourist Offices).

Holiday at full gallop

There is a funny tongue twister in Italy about Trento - and its thirty-three Trentini who trotted in (Trentatrè Trentini entrarono a Trento tutti e trentatrè trotterellando). Actually you can discover this region while riding a horse. Val di Fassa offers splendid itineraries for riding, especially along Avisio River, and through green millenary woods trails. If it is the first time, you can count on the competence of the riding stables' staff in the Valley, and children can have a better understanding of the animals' world, especially with ponies and colts, become friendly with them and try to ride them. The riding stables are: Happy Ranch (Campitello), riding stable in Campestrin, Horse Ranch Highland Cattle (Vigo di Fassa) (information at the Tourist Offices).

Pozza di Fassa

Did you know that...

San Pellegrino's hospice has a long story: built in 1358 on the meadows of the Order of Moena by the "Fрати Bianchi", it was used by those who wanted to reach Agordino (Province of Belluno) from Fassa. In the hospice patients were hosted and here the ones who did not overtake the strains of travelling were buried. Firstly in 1400 it was run by a monk nominated by the Order of Predazzo, then by a Prince Bishop of Trento. Moena's administration's aim is to renovate the building in order to re-establish its function of Refuge, and obtain rooms for geologic and Great War's exhibitions.

To participate in the initiatives for guests is compulsory to register at least one day in advance at the Tourist Offices of the Val di Fassa Card (ask your employer accommodation). The activities are reserved for guests of the associated structures all'Apt Val di Fassa.
